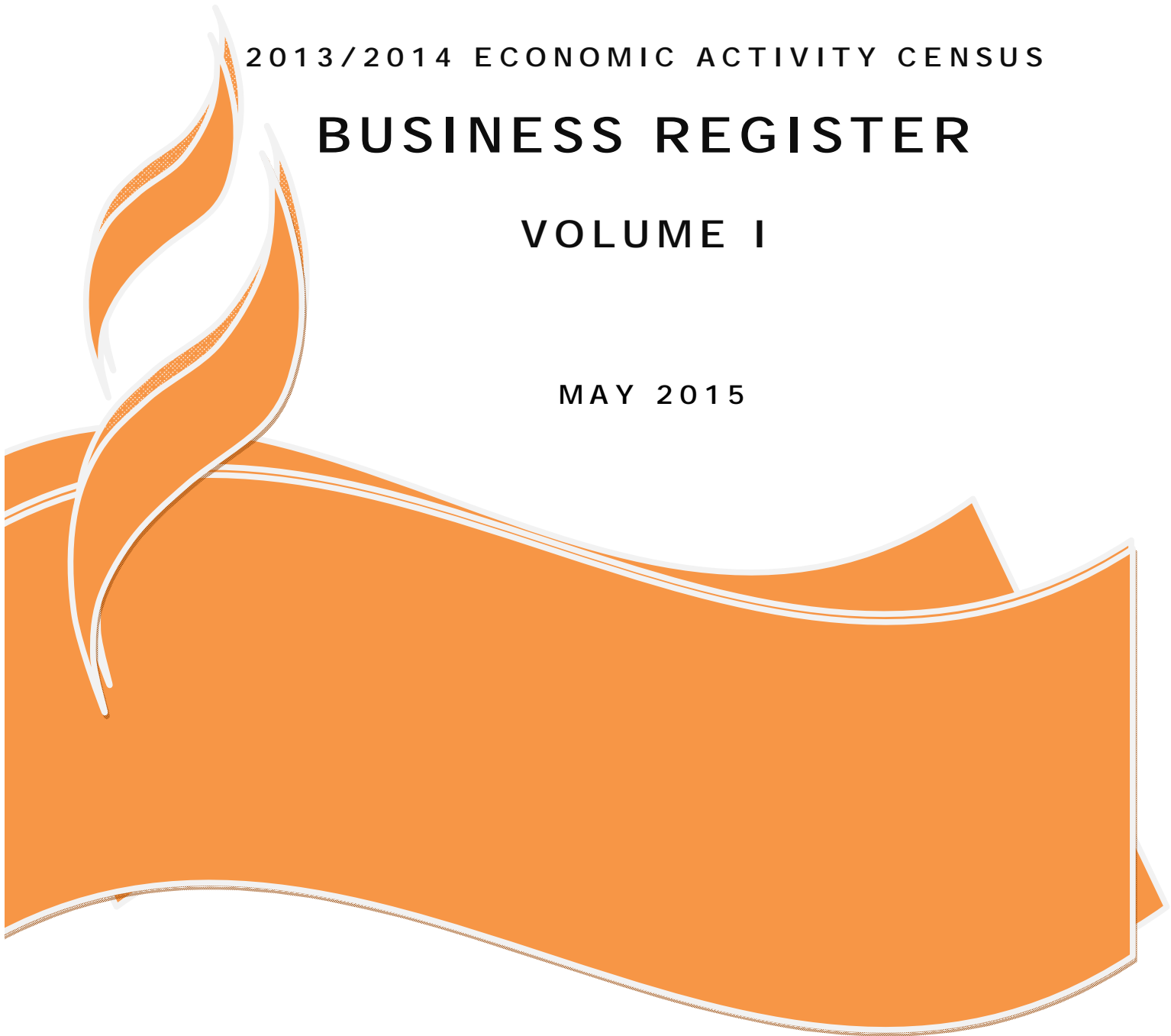

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FOREWORD

Bureau of Statistics (BOS) under the provisions in the Statistics Act, 2001, is mandated to maintain and update a Business Register (BR) for the country. BOS has depended on list of establishments compiled by the Ministry of Employment and Labour since 2007. BOS for the first time conducted a comprehensive Census of establishments in 2013/2014 with a reference period of 2012 financial year. All other industries were covered with an exception of the establishments engaged in agriculture and government.

The main objective of the Economic Activity Census (EAC) was to provide data necessary for understanding the structure of businesses in the economy and to set up a comprehensive register of businesses. The Business Register (BR) is the main source of business demographic variables such as creation and closures, structural changes in the economy brought about by operations such as the change in the line of businesses, mergers, takeovers, break ups and others. The BR serves as a basis or platform for subsequent continuous or periodic surveys on enterprises/establishments.


The Specific objectives of the EAC were as follows:

- To update and maintain a reliable register of business establishments
- To establish the number and size of business establishments engaged in different industries
- To provide disaggregated employment data by sex
- To establish business ownership, legal form and type of establishment
- To determine physical location of the business establishments across districts, constituencies and community councils and villages.
- To establish the turnover/sales as well as the value of non-financial assets.

I wish to extend sincere thanks and gratitude to the Government of Lesotho for the financial support of this very important National Project its planning stage until the implementation and dissemination of the results. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Background

The Bureau of Statistics undertook the census of establishments as phase I of the 2013/2014 Economic Activity Census. The census of establishments ran from July 2013 to September 2013 and it entailed the list of all enterprises (formal and informal, micro, small, medium and large) engaged in all activities for a reference period closest to 2012 financial year. However activities of public administration and agriculture were not covered.

Establishments were expected to disclose the information on businesses by economic activity and on other variables such as employment by sex, total sales, annual turnover and the value of fixed assets.

The findings of this report will help provide updated reliable information on the economic performance indicator as prescribed in the National Strategic Development Plan.

Operational Status

- There were 9,541 establishments listed during the census of business establishments
- 8,835 establishments in Lesotho were in operation, while 84 had ceased operation in 2012
- 55.8 percent of those in operation were in the urban areas
- Most of the enterprises that were operational were concentrated in Maseru and Leribe with 26.2 and 20.0 percent respectively

Type of Establishment

- 82.4 percent of the establishments were single enterprise
- Majority of these single enterprises (22.5 percent) were found in Maseru while the least (4.4 percent) were in Thaba-Tseka.

Legal form

- Majority of the establishments (77.0 percent) were owned by individuals (sole proprietors)
- The same pattern had been observed within each urban/rural settlement, registering 68.8 and 87.3 percent for urban and rural areas respectively
- Establishment that did not report their legal form constituted 14.0 percent

Type of Ownership

- Out of a total of 9,541 establishments, 7,434 were owned by private proprietors who are fully national, deeming it the highest amongst other types of ownership
- Foreign owned establishment on the other hand amounted to 577
- Out of the total, Maseru had the highest percent of 22.5, followed by Leribe with 19.4 percent of the private establishments owned fully by nationals, whereas the lowest was Thaba-Tseka with 4.5 percent

Activity

- Majority of businesses in the country (6,197) were engaged in Wholesale and Retail Trade
- Accommodation and food service activities, constituted the second highest industry (12.2 percent) , followed by Manufacturing (9.6 percent)
- Limited liability companies and Partnership came second from sole proprietorship in terms of legality of the establishments.

Financial year

- January-December (40.6 percent) was the most popular financial year
- April- March followed closely with 39.3 percent

Establishment Size

- More than half of establishments were classified as micro (employment of 1-4 people) nationally
- A small proportion for large establishments was observed across all districts, with the maximum of 2.7 percent in Maseru and 1.4 percent in Leribe

Turnover/Sales

- Generally, the pattern of the distribution of establishments' turnover shows higher percentages in the urban areas than in the rural areas

- The distribution of establishments with turnover less than 500,000 Maloti, for the urban and rural settlement were almost the same as they constituted 50.1 and 49.9 percent respectively
- More than 3.0 percent of all establishment reported turnover exceeding five million Maloti, from which the highest proportion (90.6 percent) were found in the urban while 9.4 percent was observed in the rural settlement.
- Single Enterprises had the highest share of turnover across all other types of establishments
- More than 17 percent of the establishments did not report the turnover/sales

Fixed assets

- On average the establishments in the urban settlement reported highest value of fixed assets than in the rural area recording 81.4 and 16.8 percent respectively
- Amongst the establishments with value of fixed assets in the range M4,499,999 - M4,999,999, Head offices reported the highest proportion (50.0 percent), while the other half was shared equally amongst Single enterprises and Branch/division of multi-establishment enterprise
- On average the establishments whose ownership was fully national and private dominated all other categories followed by those fully owned by non-nationals and private, each recording 62.5 and 14.1 percent respectively
- The establishments whose value of fixed assets were less than M499,999 were dominated by privately owned establishments whose ownership were fully national, with 84.4 percent

CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

1.0 Background

Business Register, in its simplest form, is a confidential list of businesses that are participating in a formal economy, with structural and classification information about each business. The register should provide accurate, up-to-date and consistent frames to be used for business-related statistical collections, and allow a range of collections to have consistently identified and classified units (Pacific Business Register Development Guide FINAL 20th, 02, 2014)

Timely and reliable statistics are critical for evidence-based policy and decision making and for better support to policy implementation, monitoring progress and evaluating outcomes and impacts of development initiatives and frameworks such as the Vision 2020, Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), Poverty Reduction Strategies (PRS), Growth Path Papers, and the National Strategic Development Plan (NSDP) 2012/13- 2016/17). These initiatives have accordingly resulted in an increase in the demand for continuing production of statistics for monitoring international and national developments. In addition, monitoring and evaluation of outcomes as well as The Managing for Results Agenda require regular and timely production of statistics for updating of indicators prescribed or listed in these international and national frameworks.

Lack of accurate and reliable information on the industrial structure of the economy, especially the private and informal sector has made it difficult for credible estimation of the contribution of each industry to Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and other National Accounts estimates. The industrial structural information is central to the collection of business statistics which enables identification and description of individual participation of businesses in the economy. It also provides basis and frame of establishments/enterprises from which a sample that represents a population of establishments can be selected and surveyed.

It is against this background that the Bureau of Statistics (BOS), a Department of the Ministry of Development Planning conducted an Economic Activities Census (EAC) in the fiscal year 2013/2014 with the reference period of 2012. The Economic Activity Census is the full measurement of the state of the economy. It is the total process of collecting, compiling, analysing and publishing economic data pertaining at a specific time or times, from all businesses and social establishments in a designated area or country. The census was the first of its kind to cover all economic activities which comprised Manufacturing, Construction, Mining and Quarrying, Wholesale and Retail Trade, Repair of motor vehicles, Personal and household goods, Hotels and restaurants, Transport, storage and

communication, Financial intermediation and insurance, Real estate, renting and business activities, Education, Health, and Other services. However, Agricultural activities, Activities of household employees (house helpers, gardeners, etc.) were not covered.

BOS undertook the 2013/2014 EAC in two phases:

- Phase I: Listing of all establishments in Lesotho(Large, medium, small, micro, formal or informal)
- Phase II: Enumeration of the listed establishments

This report focuses on Phase I of EAC, also known as the Business Register, and its findings.

1.1 Objectives

The first phase of the Economic Activity Census started in July 2013. Pre Census activities commenced in 2012 including the development of the project document which provided a roadmap to the process. The General and main objective of this phase was to set up a comprehensive register of businesses. The Business Register (BR) is the main source of business demographics, as it keeps track of business entry and closure, structural changes in the economy brought about by operations such as the change in the line of businesses, mergers, takeovers and break ups, to mention but a few.

The BR is also an indispensable sampling frame for enterprise and establishment censuses/surveys, such as Phase II of the Economic Activities Census, Annual Economic Survey, the Quarterly Index of Industrial Production, the Monthly Importer-Exporter Survey and the Quarterly Employment and Earnings Survey. The creation and the development of the BR is also an important condition for the implementation of the System of National Accounts. Specifically, the BR aims to achieve the following:

- The production and publishing of a general statistical directory of business establishments classified once every year
- Number of companies operating in a given year
- Number of establishments closing down in a given year
- Percentage of activities with the highest number of establishments over time
- Estimates on employment by sex
- Availability of business detailed data by industry (International standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities - ISIC level) at different geographical levels
- Ownership status of businesses
- Turnover and Fixed assets

1.2 Coverage and Scope

As discussed in the background, the Census of establishments/enterprises covered the entire country: 10 districts, 80 constituencies and 129 community councils. Urban and rural geographical disparities were used within which the four ecological zones comprising of Lowlands, Foothills, Mountains and Senqu River Valley (SRV) were covered. However, the agriculture and public sectors were not covered.

Generally, the Census (listing of establishments) mainly captured the following information:

Section A:

Area information- District, Constituency, Community Council, Village and Urban/Rural Settlement

Section B:

Establishment information – Name of establishment (Official name, Trading name)

Physical location

Contact details – Postal address, Telephone, Fax, E-mail

Operational status – Year of commencing business,

Type of establishment – Single enterprise, Branch/Division, etc.

Legal form – Sole proprietorship, Partnership, Limited liability company, etc.

Type of ownership – Fully national, Private; Fully national, Public, etc.

Section C:

Kind of activity – Principal activity, Secondary activity, License number

Financial Year

Economic variables – Number of employees by sex, Total sales, Annual Turnover, Value of fixed assets

Section D:

Administration – Questionnaire number, Commencing and Completion date of interview, Date checked by supervisor, Enumerator's name and signature, Supervisor's name and signature, Coordinator's name and signature

CHAPTER 2

METHODOLOGY

2.1 Census Listing Questionnaire

Preparation of 2012/2013 Economic Activity Census started in July 2013, commencing with activities of the listing phase. A training manual was developed in order to guide the enumerators and supervisors in the actual listing. The listing questionnaire comprised of four sections namely; a) Area information, b) Establishment Information, c) Economic characteristics and, d) Administration. The questionnaire was administered to all establishments/Enterprises engaged in the production of goods and services, whether registered or not.

Under area information, the enumerator was expected to fill in information about the District, Constituency, Community Council, Village and Settlement. The establishment information section entailed the name of the establishment, physical address, contact details and operational status. This information was required to identify businesses by their location.

2.2 Recruitment of Census Personnel

The composition of the section includes recruitment of enumerators, supervisors, and coordinators. It further comprises logistical phases on training, monitoring of work, data editing and data processing.

2.2.1 Enumerators

Enumerators engaged were trained personnel from the Bureau of Statistics: Field Officers who were already familiar with collecting statistical data. In addition, temporary staff was engaged. The enumerators were responsible for registering and coding all businesses designated to their areas.

2.2.2 Supervisors

BOS engaged own staff (Statisticians) to oversee supervision. In order to ease fieldwork, one supervisor was allocated four enumerators. Leribe, Maseru and Mafeteng, were apportioned two teams each. The major task of the supervisors was to undertake follow-ups by performing post and spot checks during enumeration.

2.2.3 Coordinators

Coordination was assigned to three personnel where each coordinator had a minimum of three districts. The coordinators were charged with making initial contacts with the supervisors. They were also responsible for spot and post checks during enumeration.

2.3 Training

Training was carried out in two different stages. The first stage involved training of supervisors that went on for one day. Enumerators were trained in the second stage and this was done two days prior the actual enumeration so that fieldwork would start immediately after training. Trainees were taken through the overview of the Economic Activity Census and its different phases. Emphasis was put on how to complete the questionnaires, interview techniques and identification of establishments. The Coordinators served as facilitators during the training, with each concentrating on a different section of the questionnaire.

2.4 Monitoring of Work

Several measures were established to monitor and control the quality of data, particularly at the enumeration stage. Coordinators and supervisors provided daily spot and post-checks in each district to facilitate smooth collection. They provided direct assistance to the enumerators, reviewing and signing completed questionnaires before submission for further processing at the office. This exercise contributed to the overall quality of the fieldwork.

2.5 Data Editing

This stage was twofold: editing in the field and office editing. Enumerators were responsible for editing and coding their own questionnaires. The questionnaires were then kept by the supervisors for further editing at the office and processing.

2.6 Data Processing

The SQL server was used to design a data entry application for capturing. There was a total of eighteen data processing staff, inclusive of a supervisor who had been trained in the software for capturing the data. Supervisors were responsible for data editing and coding, while data entry personnel captured the data. One Programmer was engaged to ensure that any errors arising from the data entry application were resolved. The data collected from the field was supplemented and validated with administrative sources from line ministries and agencies such as Lesotho Tourist Development Corporation (LTDC), Ministry of Employment and Labour (MoEL), Lesotho National Development Corporation (LNDC),

Ministry of Public Works and Transport (MoPWT) and Ministry of Trade and Industry, Cooperatives and Marketing (MTICM).

2.7 Data Limitations

Censuses of business establishments focus on enterprises as units of observations; therefore, household based establishments were not easily located. It was also observed that enterprises were reluctant to provide information on turnover/sales.

CHAPTER 3

RESULTS

3.1 Establishments and Operational Status

This section focuses on distribution of establishments by district and operational status. Table 3.1 shows that 43.4 per cent of the establishments that were either sold or leased to another operator were found in Maseru. It further had the most establishments (26.2 per cent) that were in operation, followed by Leribe with 20.0 per cent and Qacha's Nek has the least (4.5 per cent). Botha-Bothe had 55.7 per cent of those establishments that were Under Construction, Development, or Exploration.

3.2 Urban/Rural Settlement and Operational Status

The distribution of establishments by Urban/Rural Settlement and Operational Status are presented in this section. Table 3.2 indicates that majority of establishments (55.8 percent) that were In Operation were in the urban areas while 44.0 percent had ceased operation. The opposite holds for rural areas, where a considerable proportion (56.0 percent) of enterprises ceased operation. It is further presented in Table 27 (in the Annex) that most of these establishments in urban areas were more concentrated in Maseru urban than the

rest of the districts. However, from the following districts, Berea, Mafeteng, Mohale's Hoek, Quthing, Qacha's Nek and Thaba-Tseka there had more establishments in operation in rural areas. A large number of establishments that ceased operation were in rural areas. Establishments that were sold or leased to another operator were more in the urban areas than in rural areas and across districts, except in Quthing and Thaba-Tseka.

3.3 District and Type of Establishment

According to Table 3.3 it is shown that majority of establishments in Lesotho were Single Enterprises and Maseru had the most (24.3 per- cent) of those establishments, followed by Branch or division of a multi-establishment enterprise. The highest proportion of Head Offices establishments (22.1 and 21.5 percent) was in Leribe and Maseru respectively across all districts.

3.4 Establishment, District and Legal Form

“The legal form of a company is the general type it may legally use to identify itself according to the local, regional, national or international law governing it. This is normally reflected in the ending abbreviation after the company's name (inc. corp, (PTY) LTD, etc)”(<http://standardsphorio.com>, 1st March, 2015). Accordingly, businesses can be classified by their type of legal bodies.

According to table 3.4, the concentration of establishment is highest in Maseru for all types of legal forms except co-operatives, in which Berea led other districts with 53.1 percent. It was further revealed that Maseru showed Sole Proprietor (21.5 percent), Partnership (44.1 percent), Limited Liability Company (53.9 percent) and Non-profit making body (30.0 percent).

Leribe was the next district which led others in all types of legal forms except co-operatives and it reflected 19.7 percent for Sole proprietorship, 24.1 percent for Partnerships, and 10.7 percent for Limited liability Company 10.0 percent for Non-profit making body.

On the other hand, all the remaining districts contributed relatively lowest proportions of establishments classified by type of legal. The range was between 0.0 to 9.3 percent with the exception of Non-profit making body for Mokhotlong (23.3 percent).

3.5 Classifications and Legal Form

According to Table 3.5, Legal Form of establishments differed across Urban/Rural Settlement. Majority of establishments (77.0 percent) were owned by sole proprietors nationally. The same pattern had been observed within each urban/rural settlement, registering 68.8 and 87.3 percent for urban and rural areas respectively. Establishment that did not report their legal form constituted 14.0 percent.

3.6 Establishments, Urban/Rural Settlement and Ownership

Establishments can be classified according to their type of ownership. The results indicated 70.6 percent of urban based establishments were ‘fully national private’ while ‘more than 50% foreign’ was the least with 0.2 percent. In the rural areas, establishments that were fully owned by nationals and also private dominated with 87.2 percent.

3.7 Establishments and Type of Ownership

The results show that most of the private establishments belong to the persons who are Fully national. This was reflected in the total number of establishments (7,435). Out of the total, Maseru had the highest percent of 22.5, followed by Leribe with 19.4 percent of the private establishments owned fully by nationals, whereas the lowest was Thaba-Tseka with 4.5 percent. Participation of foreigners in Maseru businesses dominated other districts with 41.4 percent. The results further indicate that establishments with partnership of more than 50 percent foreigners in Maseru led other districts with 71.4 percent.

3.8 Establishments and Industries

The section highlights the number and/or percentages of establishments by industries with other variables.

Table 3.8a shows the percentage distribution of establishments by industry and type of establishment. Most (6,197) establishments were engaged in Wholesale and Retail Trade in 2012, and each type of establishment registered the relatively high proportions ranging from 65.9 to 74.5 percent during the same period. This was followed by activities in Accommodation and food service activities with 12.1 per cent as well as Manufacturing across all types of establishments.

A highest number of establishments (7,862) were Single establishments followed by 835 multi-establishment enterprises.

3.9 Employment, Industry and Sex

Table 3.9 presents the percentage distribution of establishments' employment by Industries and Sex. Manufacturing had higher (40,805) employment than all other industries, followed by Wholesale and Retail Trade with 17, 389. Arts, entertainment and recreation had the least number of employees of 23, also followed by Real Estate activities with 30 employees.

Mining and quarrying industry had more male employees (81.0 percent) than female employees with 19.0 percent. The opposite holds for manufacturing industry where female employees accounted for 75.0percent.

3.10 Industry and Turnover/Sales

Table 3.10a shows the percentage distribution of establishments' turnover/sales by industry. The total turnover for all the establishments in 2012 was reported as 30, 667 billion Maloti. Wholesale and retail trade turnover contributed substantial share of 40.7percentofthe total turnover, followed by manufacturing industrywith26.1 percent. In addition Mining and quarrying registered a moderate performance with 7.0 percent during the same period

3.11 Establishment and Financial Year

Financial Year is an accounting period that can start on any day of a calendar year but has twelve consecutive months (i.e. 52 consecutive weeks) at the end of which account books are closed, profit or loss is computed, and financial reports are prepared for filing. It may or may not match a calendar year (www.businessdictionary.com). Establishments must follow certain accounting period for effective and efficient financial procedures and processes. The most popular financial year was January-December (40.6 percent) followed closely by April- March (39.3 percent) and the others distantly ranging between the minimum of 1.2 percent to at most 3.4 percent as illustrated by Table 3.11a.

It is evident that the different administrative districts had a homogenous behaviour with regard to the most preferred establishments' accounting periods which is January to December and April to March as shown by Table 3.11b. However, there were to some extent variations in the popularity magnitudes. The notable differences were observed in Leribe, Qacha's Nek, Mokhotlong and Thaba-Tseka. Establishments in Leribe mostly followed April to March (52.2 percent) as compared to 36.3 percent for January to December financial years. An apparent observation of a January to December financial year was observed in Qacha's Nek, Mokhotlong and Thaba-Tseka, with 53.2, 45.6 and 79.6 percent as opposed to 35.3 (above half), 24.0 (below half) and 15.1 (below one fifth) per cent respectively.

3.12 Establishment Size

Several criteria are used to classify the size of an establishment: employment, turnover, amount of net assets, value added, etc. BOS opted to use the number of employees engaged. The establishments' sizes were categorized as follows; establishment with 01 to 04 employees as micro, 05 to 09 as small, 10 to 49 as medium and lastly 50 and over employees as large.

Table 3.12a presents the percentage distribution of establishments by district and establishment size. Given the economic status of Lesotho, within all 10 districts a minimum of 52.3 percent to a maximum of 86.6 percent were Micro establishments. Establishments classified as Small were within the range of 2.6 to 11.9 percent, whereas this highest sizeable proportion was evident in Maseru (11.9 per cent). A very small proportion of large establishments were observed across all districts, however comparatively higher percentages were in Maseru and Leribe (2.7 and 1.4 percent respectively).

The size of each establishment is determined by the number of defining (administrative, environmental or economic) factors. The economic status of a particular district in this instance could have had a great impact in establishing a certain size class of the enterprise. Table 3.12b shows the percentage distribution of the establishments by districts and establishment size. Maseru had the highest total percentage share (25.8 percent) as compared to all district in all classes, followed closely by Leribe with 18.9 percent. The highest share of large establishments was observed in Maseru and Leribe especially with 63.2 and 24.5 percent respectively.

Micro businesses are considered as primary core of economic activity in rural areas while urban areas are typically composed of a more diverse core of micro, small, medium, and large establishments. 3.13 Turnover ('000) and Districts

The turnover range of establishments across districts is presented in Table 3.13. In Botha-Bothe 52.3 percent of establishments reported turnover below five hundred thousand Maloti (M500,000). However, Botha Bothe registered the highest proportion (39.3 percent) of establishments that did not disclose turnover, followed closely by Mokhotlong (27.1 percent) and Leribe (25.5 percent) relative to other districts. Nationally, it was notable that about 17.7 percent of establishments did not disclose turnover. More than 3.0 percent of all establishment reported turnover exceeding five million Maloti.

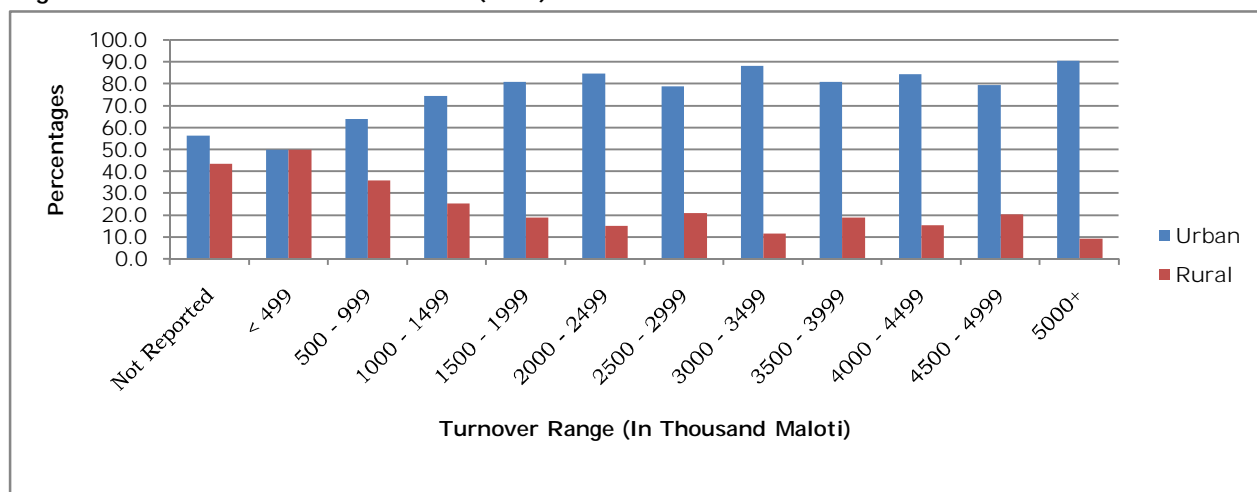

3.14 Turnover ('000) and Urban/Rural Settlement

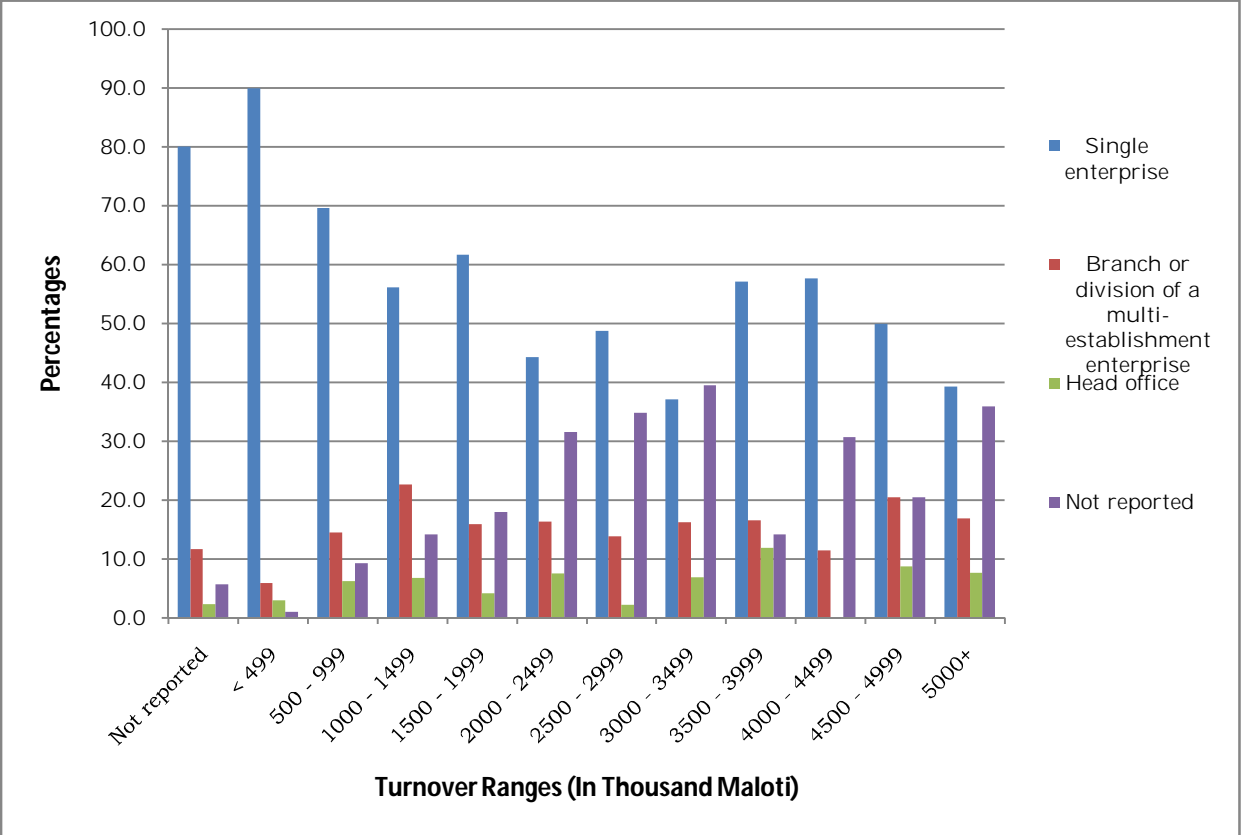
Figure 3.1 Establishment's Turnover ('000) and Urban/ Rural Settlement – 2012

Generally, the pattern of the distribution of establishments' turnover shows higher percentages in the urban areas than in the rural areas as indicated in Figure 3.1. The distribution of establishments with turnover less than 500,000 Maloti, for the urban and rural settlement were almost the same as they constituted 50.1 and 49.9 percent respectively. The finding further revealed that for those establishments with a turnover 5,000,000 Maloti and above, highest proportion were found in the urban (90.6 percent) while 9.4 percent was observed in the rural settlement.

3.15 Turnover ('000) and Type of Establishment

3.16 Turnover ('000) and Legal Form

The distribution of the establishments' turnover and legal form is shown in Table 3.16. The majority of sole proprietors (87.1 percent) had turnover below 500,000 Maloti while Non-profit making body was the least with 0.2 percent. Most Limited Liability Company (35.7 percent) observed turnover between three and four million Maloti (M3-M4 million).

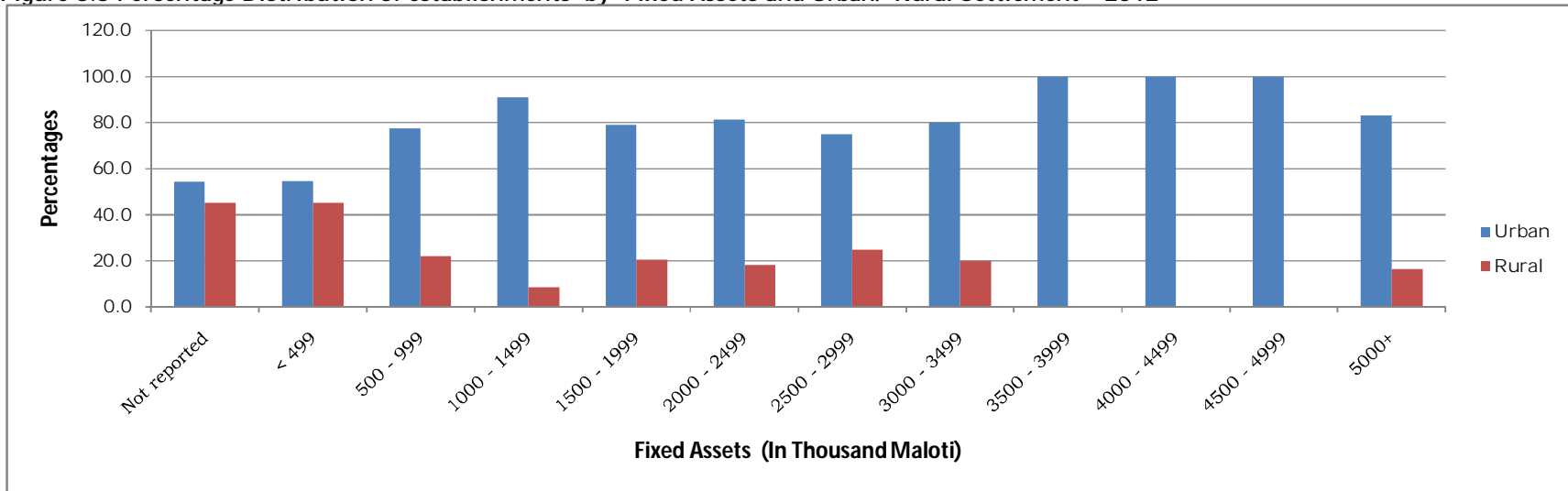

3.17 Fixed Assets ('000) and Urban/Rural Settlement

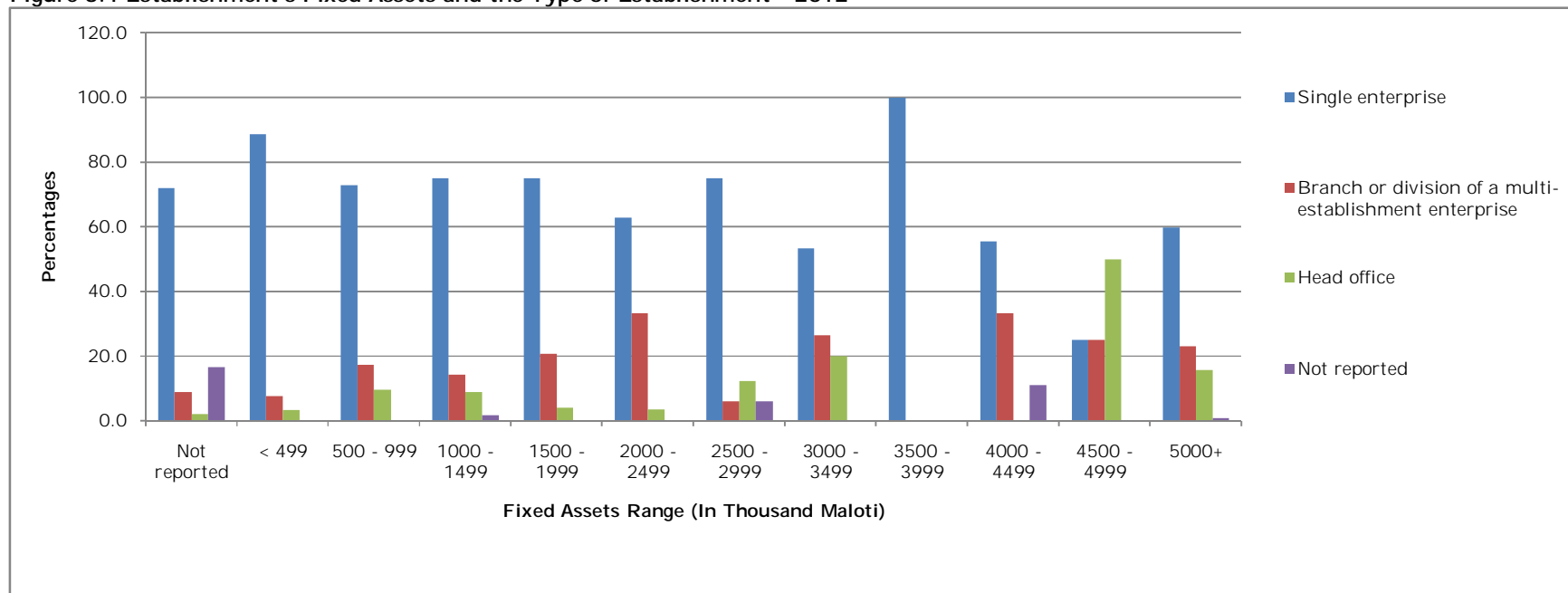
Figure 3.3 Percentage Distribution of establishments' by Fixed Assets and Urban/ Rural Settlement – 2012

The establishments were requested to report the value of their net non-financial fixed assets. Illustrated in Figure 3.3 is the percentage distribution of establishments by fixed assets and settlement. On average the establishments in the urban settlement reported highest value of fixed assets than in the rural area recording 81.4 and 16.8 percent respectively. The proportion of establishment with turnover greater than three million was minimal in the rural settings.

3.18 Fixed Assets and Type of Establishment

On average Single Enterprises recorded the highest percentage of 67.9 with regard to the value of fixed assets as depicted in Figure 3.4. Amongst establishments with value of fixed assets in the range M4,499,999 - M4,999,999 Head offices reported the highest proportion (50.0 percent), while the other half was shared equally amongst Single enterprises and Branch/division of multi-establishment enterprise. It was observed that about 72.0 percent of the Single enterprises did not report the value of their assets.

3.19 Fixed Assets and Ownership

Table 3.17 presents percentage distribution of establishments' fixed assets and ownership. On average the establishments whose ownership was fully national and private dominated all other categories followed by those fully owned by non-nationals and private, each recording 62.5 and 14.1 percent respectively. The establishments whose value of fixed assets were less than M499,999 were dominated by privately owned establishments who were fully national, with 84.4 percent.

Conclusion

Operational Status

There were 9,541 establishments listed during the census of business establishments (Phase I) of the 2013/2014 Economic Activity Census. In general, it was reported that most of the establishments in Lesotho (8,835) were still in operation, while 84 had ceased operation in 2012. It is also evident that 55.8 percent of those in operation were found in the urban areas, especially Maseru urban. Regarding the districts most of the enterprises that were operational were concentrated in Maseru and Leribe with 26.2 and 20.0 percent respectively.

Type of Establishment

The study has revealed that most of the establishments (82.4) were single enterprise and most of these single enterprises (22.5 percent) were found in Maseru while the least (4.4 percent) were in Thaba-Tseka.

Legal form

Majority of the establishments (77.0 percent) were owned by individuals (sole proprietors). The same pattern had been observed within each urban/rural settlement, registering 68.8 and 87.3 percent for urban and rural areas respectively. Establishment that did not report their legal form constituted 14.0 percent.

Type of Ownership

Type of ownership reflected that out of a total of 9,541 establishments, 7,434 were owned by private proprietors who are fully national, deeming it the highest amongst other types of ownership. Foreign owned establishment on the other hand amounted to 577. Out of the total, Maseru had the highest percent of 22.5, followed by Leribe with 19.4 percent of the private establishments owned fully by nationals, whereas the lowest was Thaba-Tseka with 4.5 percent.

Activity

Majority of businesses in the country (6,197) were engaged in Wholesale and Retail Trade, from which higher numbers were single establishments. This is followed by Accommodation and food service activities, then Manufacturing. Limited liability companies and Partnership came second from sole proprietorship in terms of legality of the establishments.

Financial year

The most popular financial year was January-December (40.6 percent) followed closely by April- March (39.3 percent) and the others distantly ranging between the minimum of 1.2 percent to at most 3.4 percent.

Establishment Size

Nationally, more than half of establishments were classified as micro (employment of 1-4 people). As for large establishments, a fairly small proportion was observed across all districts, with the maximum of 2.7 percent in Maseru and 1.4 percent in Leribe.

Turnover/Sales

Generally, the pattern of the distribution of establishments' turnover shows higher percentages in the urban areas than in the rural areas. The distribution of establishments with turnover less than 500,000 Maloti, for the urban and rural settlement were almost the same as they constituted 50.1 and 49.9 percent respectively. The findings revealed that more than 3.0 percent of all establishment reported turnover exceeding five million Maloti, from which the highest proportion (90.6 percent) were found in the urban while 9.4 percent was observed in the rural settlement. It was further observed that Single Enterprises had the highest share of turnover across all other types of establishments.

Fixed assets

On average, the establishments in the urban settlement reported highest value of fixed assets than in the rural area recording 81.4 and 16.8 percent respectively. Amongst the establishments with value of fixed assets in the range M4,499,999 - M4,999,999, Head offices reported the highest proportion (50.0 percent), while the other half was shared equally amongst Single enterprises and Branch/division of multi-establishment enterprise.

On average, the establishments whose ownership was fully national and private dominated all other categories followed by those fully owned by non-nationals and private, each recording 62.5 and 14.1 percent respectively.
